
Consent for taking photos of Cambridge English candidates on exam day - for candidates

The British Council will use your photo for administration of the Cambridge English exam. The British Council shall pass your photo on to Cambridge English organisation in connection with administration of the Cambridge English exam.

The number of candidates wishing to use their Cambridge English qualifications for purposes such as immigration and access to work and higher education continues to increase. This is why test day photography has been introduced in order to raise the level of exam security and to help organisations (faculties, employers, embassies, interior ministries) to have access to examination results.

The photograph is strictly confidential and is stored by Cambridge English.

The photo taken on the day of the test, as well as the candidate's result, name, date of birth and gender, will be available on the secure Online Results Verification website for use by organisations wishing to verify the results. Candidates will be able to control who can access their results and view their photos. Cambridge English retains the right not to issue results for candidates who have not been photographed.

By signing this consent form, candidates agree to have their photo taken on exam day.
